


- It offers clear information about school funding in Texas.

The <u>Love Letter instructions</u> give you pdf files for postcards, tell you how to print them, offer advice about your message and tell you where to send the finished Love Letters so Just Fund It TX can deliver them to lawmakers.

You will find options for printing in color or black and white, and in English or in Spanish.

To save time and money, we also have instructions for using index cards to make your own.


Encourage people to photograph their Love Letters before you collect them, then share their images on social media with #JustFundItTX and #Don'tMessWithTXKids.

Who Represents Me?


Who Represents Me? This easy tool answers that question.

Creating Facebook Events & Free Evite Email Invitations

Facebook events

Facebook events can be a great way to invite people to an event. It's especially useful if you are hosting an event that's open to anyone.

To create a private or public Facebook event:

- From your News Feed, click Events in the left menu.
- Click + Create Event on the left side.
- Click to choose between a private or public event. If you're creating a public event, you can set the event's host as yourself or a page you manage. You're not able to change the privacy settings once you've created the event.
- Fill in the event name, details, location and time.
- Click Create. You'll be taken to your event where you can invite guests, upload photos, add a cover photo or video, share posts and edit event details.

Evite invitations

<u>Evite</u> and similar online tools let you create free invitations to share via email. Guests can RSVP and comment, and you can set your invitation to send reminders. You can find <u>instructions</u> on their website.

Invitation language

You know your audience, so feel free to write your own invitation. Here's some language to get you started:

Did you know that Texas ranks 43rd nationally in per student funding for public schools? Did you know that Texas is home to 5.4 million public school students – about 10% of all public school kids in the US?

Did you know that Texas increasingly relies on property taxes to pay for our schools? Did you know that there are some easy ways to learn more and make a difference?

Join us to learn how people from across the state are coming together to make one clear request to Texas legislators: Do the right thing – adequately fund public education!

This is a chance to learn the facts and to take some fun and easy actions with a group of other public education supporters. It's our chance to show our love for public schools and the future of Texas!
