LETTER TEMPLATE

We are writing to request that the State of Texas release all federal funding from recent coronavirus relief and stimulus acts directly to our state's school districts, as intended by federal legislation. Almost \$18 billion in federal funds has been allocated for K-12 education in Texas. This funding is essential to meet the needs of our students and schools, and it is a key component of a successful recovery for our community and our state.

That's a powerful tool to ensure we emerge from this moment strong and ready to succeed. By withholding funding from our schools, Texas is harming our students, our community, and our state.

In other states, federal funds are already reaching schools as intended. Districts are making smart use of those funds. And students and communities are seeing the benefits. But here in Texas, our schools, students, and communities are waiting for funds that are not being released as intended.

Every day without that funding is a day that needs continue to grow and a day that the opportunity to use those funds as intended is missed. We join together to ask you to support our community and every Texas community by ensuring these funds are used as intended. It's the right thing for students. It's the right thing for our community. And it's the right thing to ensure a successful recovery for Texas.
